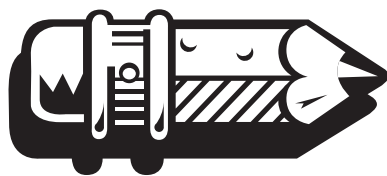

Dear Children,

This morning we look at a Psalm that is not very familiar to most people, and yet, it is the favorite of some.

If ever there were truly a “missionary psalm” this Psalm 67 would be it!

This Psalm encourages us to ask God for blessings in our lives, but not with selfish motives; not for self-seeking reasons. The Psalm tells us to learn how to ask for God’s blessings in our lives so that we might be a blessing to others.

We should take all our blessings ~ our homes, our schools, our education, our moms and dads, our money, our gifts, our talents, our abilities ~ and use them to bless others who do not know Jesus.

When we do this, God will use us in the lives of unbelievers to draw them to Himself. They will then be able to sing the praises of God like you do. They will know what it feels like to be forgiven for their sins like you do.

This morning we will be praying especially for Mr. Dan Faber and his wife, Dale. They are leaving Trinity Church soon to become missionaries in China. They will live in Montgomery for a couple of more years, so we will see them. But we need to really be praying for their safety, their ministry, and their raising the money to go to China.

Look for us to sing many hymns of praise and thanksgiving today.

MUSIC and HYMNS

Make a joyful noise unto the Lord...

#5 “God, My King, Thy Might Confessing”

Based on Psalm 145, Richard Mant published this hymn in 1824. Notice how verses 1, 3, 4 and 6 address God, himself, in praise of His works, love, and mercy. In the others (2 and 5) the hymn writer tells how we should join him in sharing these aspects of God with our fellow man. Do we do that on a daily basis?

#644 “May the Mind of Christ My Savior”

This hymn is based on Philippians 2:5, “Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus”. This means that our attitudes should be like that of Christ---not demanding his “rights” as God, but being willing to become “servants” like Christ did. Each verse takes an attribute of Christ for us to imitate. See if you can identify each one of those from your hymnal.
