

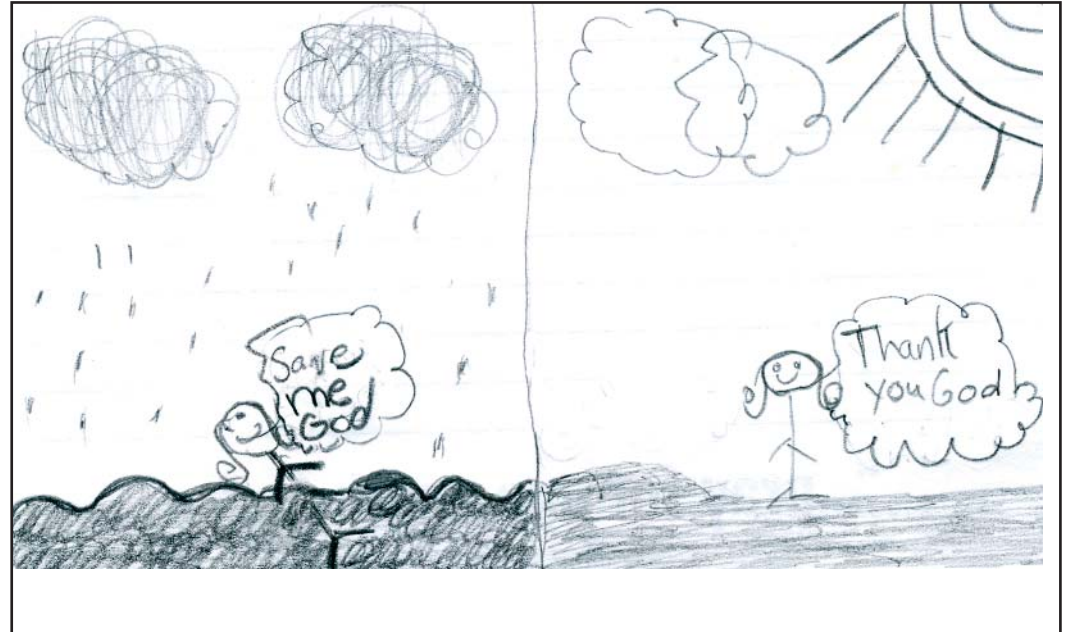

Dear Children,

I hope you'll notice something different in the Children's Bulletin this morning.

In the Family Worship section, there are not as many questions, but rather suggestions about what you can do as a family each night of the week.

My favorite is Saturday night because when my children were your age (we actually sometimes still do it this way), EVERYONE in the family would lie down with our faces to the ground. This shows great respect to God. And we would put our hands together in the middle.

But, because we have five people in our family, and furniture in the den where we usually pray together, we didn't all fit perfectly. So, Claude Mc may be facing one way, and Nan another and Abbey another. But the goal was that everyone was touching everyone else in the family.

It was fun. Abbey's leg may be touching Nan's arm; and her left hand may be holding her mother's arm, while her right hand was holding mine; and her other leg may be touching Claude Mc's head. But everyone had to be touching everyone else in the family.

And we would wait, asking: "Okay, is everyone touching everyone in the family?" Then we would pray for the next day: for Daddy as he preaches, for Sunday School, for help getting up in the morning, for good sleep, etc.

I hope you have fun getting together with your family for times of Bible reading and prayer.

A Guide to Family Worship

A Morning Prayer to be Prayed Each Morning as a Family:

Thou, who art the true Sun of the world, evermore rising, and never going down; who by Thy most wholesome appearing and light dost nourish and make joyful, all things both in heaven and on earth: we beseech Thee mercifully and favorably to shine into our hearts that the night and darkness of sin, and the mists of error on every side, being driven away, we may all our life long go without any stumbling or offense, and may walk as in the daytime, being pure and clean from the works of darkness, and abounding in all good works which Thou hast prepared for us to walk in; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen

Suggested Hymns: #295 "Crown Him with Many Crowns"

Suggested Family Worship Topics:

Monday: Read Isaiah 53

Tuesday: How can we know that God is always with us? Can we take comfort in knowing that Jesus has felt all the pain we feel? Read or sing the hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus."

Wednesday: Discuss ~ I know in Psalm 69 that David calls upon God to judge his enemies and to bring down His wrath on them; but Jesus tells me to love my enemies, to do good to them who hate me, and to pray for them. I also know, Jesus prayed for the forgiveness of His enemies from the cross.

Thursday: Read Hebrews 4:14-16

Friday: Everyone in the family express one thing for which they are thankful. Have a time in prayer in which everyone in the family prays only thanksgiving. Don't ask God for anything; just thank Him.

Saturday: Before bed, everyone in the family gathers for prayer. Mom or Dad can read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. After discussing the next morning (getting up, getting dressed, being ready for worship and Sunday School), let every one in the family lie prostrate... on their face, and pray for the Sabbath. Pray for worship, for Mr. Mac, for the one leading the service, for the choir and Mr. Reed and Mr. Rojek, for the preaching and singing and prayers.

Where Do Our Missionaries Live and Work?

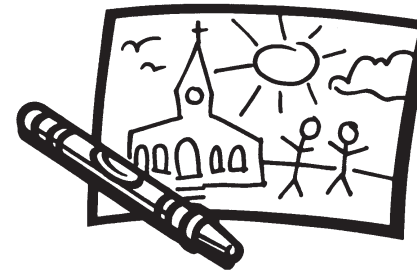
