

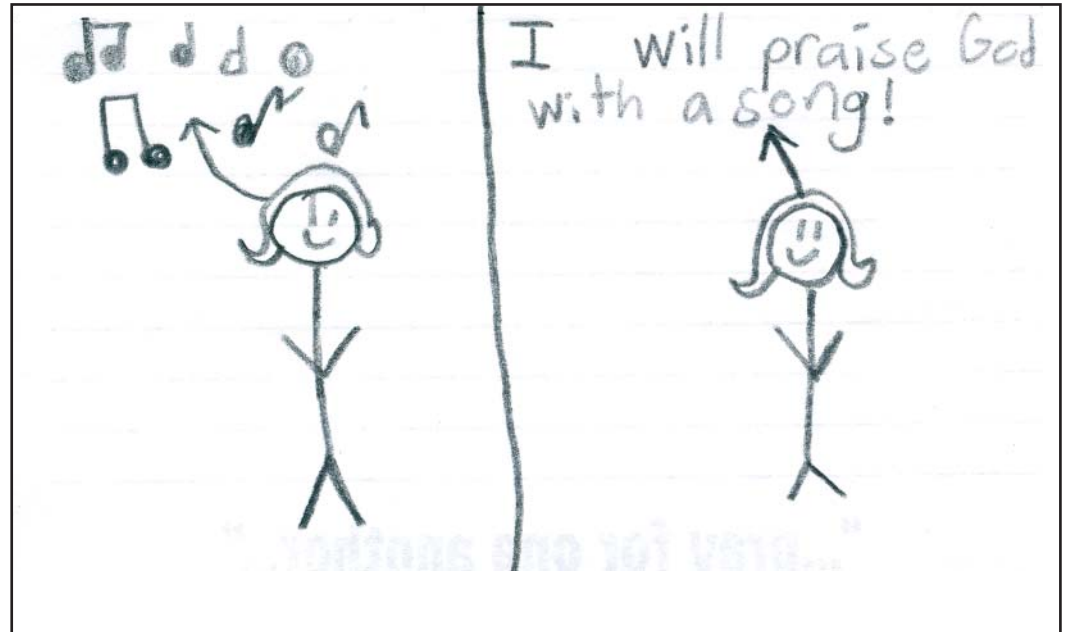

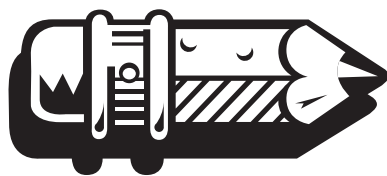

# MUSIC and HYMNS

“The Church’s One Foundation”

This hymn, also, speaks of the church like a city with a foundation built on Christ the Lord. What else do you see the church compared to in verse 1 of this hymn? Verse 2 then tells us how the elect are really one people bound by one holy name, one holy food, and one hope, even though we might live all over the world. Verse 3 tells how the world views the church and describes the hardships we the saints must endure, but then assures us we, the church, shall never perish!

“Our God, Our Help in Ages Past”

This is a paraphrase of Psalm 90, written in 1719 by Isaac Watts. The tune was composed by William Croft, who was the organist at St. Anne's Church in London; hence the hymn tune ST. ANNE. The original hymn had 9 stanzas, but we have only 7 in this hymnal. If you read this hymn verse by verse like you would read Psalm 90 straight from the Bible, it is easy to understand. Notice the many references to God being “eternal, everlasting, & endless”. What a comfort that He has been our “help, hope, shelter, security, defender, & guardian” through the endless ages, forever and ever!

# A Guide to Family Worship

A Morning Prayer to be Prayed Each Morning as a Family:

Almighty and most merciful father, in whom we live and move and have our being, to whose tender compassion we owe our safety in days past, together with all the comforts of this present life, and the hopes of that which is to come: we praise Thee, O God, our exceeding joy, who daily pourest Thy benefits upon us. Grant, we beseech Thee, that Jesus our Lord, the Hope of glory, may be formed in us, in all humility, patience, and absolute surrender of our souls and bodies to Thy holy will and pleasure. Leave us not, nor forsake us, O Father, but conduct us safe through all changes of our condition here, in an unchangeable love to Thee, and in holy tranquility of mind in Thy love to us, till we come to dwell with Thee and rejoice in Thee for ever. Amen.

Suggested Family Worship Topics:

- Monday:** Read Psalm 70  
Discuss: Have you ever prayed like this? Have you cried out to God for immediate help?
- Tuesday:** Read John 16:33; I Corinthians 10:13  
Discuss: When have I known times of trouble or temptation? Do I know that God will not give me more than I can handle?
- Wednesday:** Read Philippians 4:6-7  
Discuss ~ To Whom do we pray? Why?  
Discuss ~ What are some different ways to pray? Mr. Mac mentioned the Lord's Prayer and ACTS (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication)
- Thursday:** Read Matthew 5:43-47  
Discuss: In what ways can we pray for our enemies?
- Friday:** Read Job 1:20-21  
Discuss: How can we use our trials to be a blessing to others?
- Saturday:** Before bed, everyone in the family gathers for prayer. Mom or Dad can read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. After discussing the next morning (getting up, getting dressed, being ready for worship and Sunday School), let every one in the family lie prostrate... on their face, and pray for the Sabbath. Pray for worship, for Mr. Mac, for the one leading the service, for the choir and Mr. Reed and Mr. Rojek, for the preaching and singing and prayers.



## Where Do Our Missionaries Live and Work?

Charles was raised in Nashville, TN and graduated from The University of the South and Trinity Evangelical Divinity School. Carol grew up in Montgomery, AL, graduated from Auburn and The University of Tennessee.

Charles and Carol served as church planters with MTW in Mexico City where they led a ministry to reach students and adults, forming a new church which eventually was handed over to Mexican leaders. In 1998 Charles accepted a call to become the Missions Pastor at Christ Presbyterian Church in Nashville. While there he led the church to expand its cross-cultural outreach both locally and overseas.

Charles and Carol sensed God leading them back to the mission field, this time to Spain. Though Spain is known as "hard soil" for the gospel, they are optimistic because recent signs indicate that the young adults are more open to the gospel. They hope to see many people won to Christ and new churches started.
