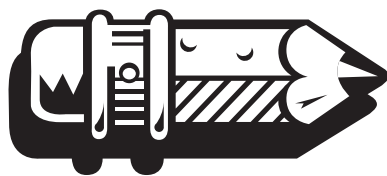

just a word from **Mr. Mac**

Dear Children,

I am 45 years old.

I remember when my mother turned 40 and thinking she was old. Now, I don't think 40 is so old. In fact, I don't think 50 is so old. Even 60 doesn't look bad to me.

My dad is 77. He is married to a woman 11 years younger than him, so it keeps him young. I would say he's a "young 77." But he stays active, he walks, and he loves to serve in the church.

How old is "old" to you?

Is it your grandmother's or grandfather's age? Is it your mom and dad's age? Am I old to you?

In the Psalm we will look at this morning, the Psalmist is old. He is writing as an older man who has been through many trials and tribulations. In fact, he is old and he still is in the midst of enemies who want to destroy Him.

But He has learned so much over the years, and one of the most important things he has learned is that God is faithful; that God will not let him down; that God is his strength; and that God has been with him since the day he was born!

That would be a nice thing to know when I am old: that God has never once let me down in all my years!

Can you say that at your young age? Can you say that God has never once let you down? Do you know, as a Christian, that will never end?! He will always be by your side no matter where you are or how old you get.

I'm excited about this morning's worship: the hymns and prayers and Psalm 71.

Pray for me; I'll be praying for you too.

A Guide to Family Worship

A Morning Prayer to be Prayed Each Morning as a Family:

Lord, lift up the light of Thy countenance upon us; let Thy peace rule in our hearts, and may it be our strength and our song. We commit ourselves to Thy care and keeping this day; let Thy grace be mighty in us and sufficient for us. Keep us from sin; give us the rule over our own spirits; and prevent us from speaking unadvisedly with our lips. May we live together in peace and holy love, and do Thou command Thy blessing upon us, even life for evermore. Prepare us for all the events of the day; for its joys as well as for its trials. Give us grace to deny ourselves, to take up our cross daily, and to follow in the steps of our Lord and Master. Amen.

Suggested Hymns: #38 "Immortal, Invisible, God Only Wise"

Suggested Family Worship Topics:

- Monday: Read Psalm 71
Discuss: Who are the oldest people we know? How can we best minister to them? Are we doing all we can to serve them and to show them honor?
- Tuesday: Read II Corinthians 4:16-18
Discuss: How much greater will heaven be than earth? What can we look forward to in heaven?
- Wednesday: Everyone name one thing they really like about each person in the family. Then go around the room and pray thanksgiving (try not to ask for anything; just thank Him for all your blessing). Count your many blessings, name them one by one.
- Thursday: Read I Samuel 7:9-13
Discuss: Ebenezer (v. 12) means a Stone of Help. Samuel set up the stone as a reminder that God had helped them. What is an Ebenezer in your life? (The Word of God? An event? A person? Trinity Church? The pulpit at TPC? Another place like a camp or the lake?)
- Friday: Read Psalm 139:13-16, 23-24
Discuss: As a young person, how can I prepare for old age?
- Saturday: Before bed, everyone in the family gathers for prayer. Mom or Dad can read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. After discussing the next morning (getting up, getting dressed, being ready for worship and Sunday School), let every one in the family lie prostrate... on their face, and pray for the Sabbath. Pray for worship, for Mr. Mac, for the one leading the service, for the choir and Mr. Reed and Mr. Rojek, for the preaching and singing and prayers.

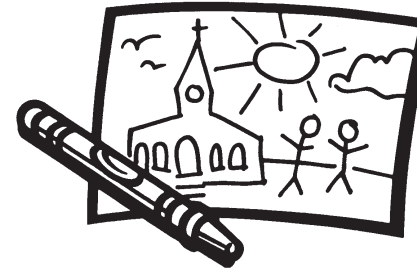
