Dear Children,

What do you think that it means to be clean? When you think of being clean do you think about taking a bath or a shower? Maybe you think about helping with the dusting and vacuuming in your home, or washing your clothes. I love the smell of Pine-Sol because I associate that smell with cleanliness. Cleanliness has to do with washing away the dirt and germs and, in this morning's sermon, sin.

Our Scripture lesson will be from the Old Testament book of Leviticus and the New Testament book of Luke. Leviticus gets its name from the word "Levites" who were priests chosen by God to be workers at the tabernacle. Chapter 14 tells the priests how to cleanse people that had bad skin diseases, usually leprosy. People that had leprosy were considered "unclean" and the Levites were given very specific steps that they had to follow in order to cleanse a leper. On the other hand, Luke 17:11-19 is an account of the healing of 10 lepers by Jesus. I want you to listen to Mr. Curles very carefully as he tells all of us how these 10 lepers were really cleansed. What is that really healed them?

Be sure that your parents have October 18th on their calendars because you will want to be here for this very important date in the life of our church. Our Fall Bible Conference will continue on October 19th and 20th, so finish your homework early and come join us at 6:00 each evening!!

"To God Be the Glory"

This is one of the more than 9,000 hymns Fanny Crosby wrote after she reached her 40's. Blind from birth because of a mistake made by the doctor in treating an eye infection, she knew Jesus well and memorized scripture, whole chapters at a time, and gloried in the joy of meeting Jesus, which she did at the age of 90. Read carefully the three verses and refrain of this hymn—it is very easy to understand and says so much to us today, 125 years later.

"Savior, like a Shepherd Lead Us"

Of all the names and titles given to Jesus, perhaps the most comforting and beloved is that of Shepherd, a title Jesus gave himself in John 10:14. The Good Shepherd knows His sheep, guards His sheep, knows His sheep by name, and even gives His life for His sheep. This hymn depicts us as sheep who are totally dependent on Christ, who has promised to guard and defend us. The phrase "thou hast bought us, Thine we are" is taken from 1 Cor. 6:20. Our salvation is the topic of verse three. He has "promised to receive us, poor and sinful though we be; . . . he has "grace to cleanse and power to free (from sin)". "Early let us turn to thee" is a prayer that we would turn to Christ at a very early age—perhaps as a child—and not to wait until we are old. Do YOU know Jesus as your savior, friend, and shepherd?

Cathy likes to teach others quilting.

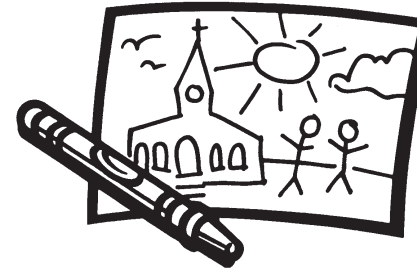
