just a word from **Mr. Mac**

Dear Children,

Today is a very important day in the life of our church. It is called Reformation Sunday because on this day we celebrate something that happened over 400 years ago. There was one of the greatest revivals in the history of the church.

THE greatest revival was just after the Lord's ascension in the early church called Pentecost. At this time, God poured out His Holy Spirit on the Church, and what happened AFTER Pentecost is what we pray for Trinity Church today... some 2000 years later.

Listen to this from Acts 2 ~

42 And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers. 43 Then fear came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were done through the apostles. 44 Now all who believed were together, and had all things in common, 45 and sold their possessions and goods, and divided them among all, as anyone had need.

And do you know, we want the same thing for Trinity Church. We want to see these very things in our lives.... the same interest... the same fellowship... the same generosity... the same prayers... the same preaching. And God will bless us with His Spirit.

Listen closely this morning, and you will understand better what these words mean and how to pray for it.

Suggested Family Worship Topics:

- Monday: Read Acts 2:40-47 (We will read this each night this week.)

- Friday: Read Acts 2:40-47
Discuss: Looking at last Lord's Day bulletin, what in Mr. Mac's sermon outline do you most enjoy about Trinity Church? How can you pray for that for the church?
- Saturday: Before bed, everyone in the family gathers for prayer. Mom or Dad can read Mr. Mac's letter to the children. After discussing the next morning (getting up, getting dressed, being ready for worship and Sunday School), let every one in the family lie prostrate... on their face, and pray for the Sabbath. Pray for worship, for Mr. Mac, for the one leading the service, for the choir and Mr. Reed and Mr. Rojek, for the preaching and singing and prayers.

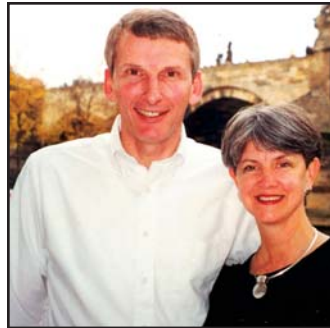
Around the World and Here at Home

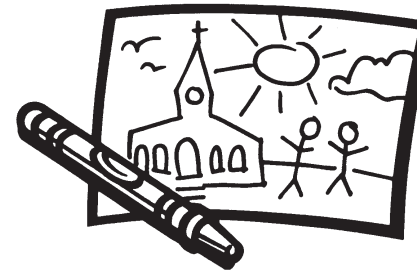
They have four adult children: Jonathan, Joshua, Bethany and Amy.
