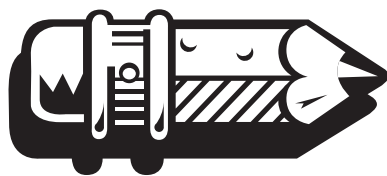

Dear Children,

I remember when I was in High School at a Bible Study when I first heard Jesus called, “King Jesus.” The teacher seemed so comfortable with it; he just referred to Jesus as “King Jesus.” That made a huge impression on me.

There are many names of God offered in this Psalm (68) this morning. Some of them include Yahweh, Yah, Elohim, El Adonai, and Shaddai. He is called “the God Who rides on the clouds,” “a father to the fatherless, a defender of widows,” “the Sovereign Lord,” and “He Who thunders with might voice.”

In fact, we will sing a song this morning called “El Shaddai.” I think most people will know this hymn in our hymnal. As we sing it, look for all the different names of God.

And then, finally, at the end of my sermon we will talk again about Jesus our King, and then conclude worship singing the praises of this great God.

I hope you enjoy this Psalm this morning. It’s a little longer than the ones we’ve been looking at, but it is beautiful. There is a time in the New Testament when Paul actually quotes Psalm 68 when referring to Jesus ascending as KING!

We love God’s Word, don’t we?! He is so good to have given us the Bible.

I’ll look forward to seeing you in worship.

“Holy, Holy, Holy!”

If it’s praise songs you want to sing, take a look at this one! It is PURE praise all the way through. It tells when (early in the morning), where (in earth and sky and sea), and who (all the saints, cherubim and seraphim). It describes the attributes of God – merciful, mighty, holy, perfect in power, love & purity, and blessed. Written in the early 1800’s, we haven’t seen a better praise hymn since.

Suggested Discussion Questions:

1. Psalm 68 uses a lot of names for God. Can you think of different names of God? Can you remember any names of God Mr. Mac mentioned this morning in his sermon? What name or title of God means the most to you: Father? Almighty God? One Who rides on the clouds? El Shaddai? Divine Warrior?

2. What does God do for you? How does God take care of you?

3. Is God faithful to you? How do you know?

4. How does God give you victory in your life? (sin, temptation, fear, etc.)

5. Why are the other mountains jealous of Mount Zion?

6. What do we mean when we say things like, "God uses the weak and humble rather than the strong and mighty." Or, "When I am weak, then I am strong." Or, "God is glorified in my weakness." (This would be a great discussion as a family!)

7. Is Jesus King? Are there any kings greater than Jesus? How can you worship King Jesus? How can we let our friends, our neighbors, and the world know that Jesus is King?

8. What did you learn most from the sermon today?

Joy mentors and encourages team leaders' wives as they serve in these often severe and isolated locations.

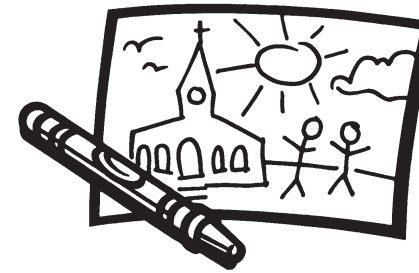
The Dagers have four adult daughters.
